



# **HOLES IN ONE Increasing on our Golf Course** Congratulations go to:

**Richard Cookson** for a Hole in One on 28<sup>th</sup> April. Richard used his 21 Degree Rescue Wood on the 9<sup>th</sup> Hole to hit a Hole In One.

This is the fourth Hole in One for Richard. He has had two on the First Tee at Southwold, one of which was in an official club match and is recorded on the board in the Clubhouse, and the third was at Diss in April 2015. An impressive record.

**Roger Wilshaw** who shot his first Hole in One on Friday, 28<sup>th</sup> June. Playing with **Terry Gunton**, he used a 7 Iron on the 10<sup>th</sup> Hole to reach the hole in one shot. Since the Clubhouse was empty he admits he got away cheaply. (For those who might be hoping for a drink at this late stage – a bit like slow play – there is probably only a limited amount of time to get one – See **Richard** or **Brian Brandwood** for the relevant rule)

#### When is a Hole In One not a Hole in One? Junior Captain's Experience

My name is **Joe Ford** and I am the current Junior Captain at Southwold Golf Club. On a memorable day I almost achieved my second hole-in-one!

A couple of weeks ago on a testing day with stormy winds. I had reached the 18th hole, which is a Par 3 on the course. The hole was playing approximately 165 yards on the day, although it is usually shorter without the winds. I hit a 7 iron for my first shot which went long, with an uncertain feeling if it was still in bounds. I decided to play a provisional (second golf ball) and used the same iron. This time I holed it. Unfortunately, I found my first ball so the shot I holed didn't in the end count and I had to use the first ball. I ended up with a score of 4 rather than a 3 with the second ball.



Golfing tradition dictates that any golfer who makes a hole in one buys the drinks afterwards. So, I had a silver lining after all, but Dad told me that he had added golf cover to our normal travel insurance so the insurers will pay out £300 if you get a hole in one. But it's OK as I'm too young to buy alcohol anyway...

In other parts of the Junior Section, **Ruben Harvey** won the Club Championship handicap prize with a 4 under handicap win over both rounds, in which I was second. Furthermore, I also came second in the scratch prize for the Club Championship with a 72,78 – 150 overall score.

The juniors have had a great year so far and there are now many new juniors joining and enjoying the game with the help and guidance of our professional and knowledgeable club pro, **Richard Smith**.

# **Development Fund Update Gents Changing Room**

Thanks to the support of members' donations, with the enhanced Gift Aid benefit, donations from local Trusts and last year's successful Festival of Golf Week the Club has successfully raised sufficient funds over the last 12 months to progress with the refurbishment of the Gents' toilet and showering facilities.

During the discussions with our contractors, it has been proposed (subject to Executive Ratification) to invest Club funds into improving the layout of the TV/Snug area. This will involve removing the existing rear wall which backs onto the gents' locker rooms and incorporating the existing external void within the Clubhouse building. This added space will enhance our Clubhouse and help facilitate an ever growing number of users of the Club. This new proposal will also streamline the access into the Gents 'Changing Room.

A further added benefit that could be completed would be the addition of a door accessing the current disabled toilet from the Ladies' Locker Room. This would enhance the ladies' shower facilities.

## **Swing Room / Practice Facilities**

The Club has now reviewed all costs associated with the implementation of a Swing Room. It has been agreed by the Club's Executive, in conjunction with our Pro, that this proposal would not be commercially viable. As such, the Club is now committed to improving our existing practice facilities utilising the funds (£3,500) that have recently been raised at the successful 2019 Festival of Golf. This will include the purchase of a covered driving bay, new matting and tee boxes.

## General Manager's Report

With the hugely enjoyable and successful Festival of Golf Week having just finished it seems a good opportunity to reflect on what a great golf club we have here. Many invited guests, members and visitors alike expressed their enjoyment and we are also delighted to report that Roger Sweet and his team raised an additional £3500 for the Club's development fund. Roger also raised a further £1900 for his chosen charity, the Clare School in Norwich.



The Club's plans to redevelop the Gents toilets are well underway with the enhancement of the TV/ snug area also a real possibility. A proposal has been received from our contractors to incorporate the void of space between the TV room and snug. This enhancement in space would be a direct benefit to

the Clubhouse, increasing our indoor space for our ever-growing membership. It is also planned to add a door into the disabled toilet from the Ladies' Locker Room, increasing the showering facilities.

Our Golf Group continue to plan improvements to our practice facilities and review all options. With the escalation of costs associated with constructing a bespoke swing room this plan has been shelved. As such it is a priority to improve our current practice facilities. This will include new tee boxes and also a moveable covered driving bay.

With our "peak playing season" all but complete, our focus turns to our planned improvements to the golf course. The new bunker set up on the 9th will be our first priority with work due to start in the coming weeks. This will result in this hole being closed for a couple of days whilst work is in progress. The bunkers will then be GUR for several months whilst the new grass knits in. This new set up is designed to offer a fair test for all, taking into consideration accessibility issues that have been previously raised.

Other jobs including gorse clearance and the installation of a new footpath and bridge onto our practice field will commence thereafter.

I hope you all continue to enjoy SGC and you will look forward to seeing the Club develop over the coming months.

### **Rules are Rules**

#### Rule 10

Rule 10.2b covers other help.

A caddie or partner is allowed to point out the line of play for a stroke anywhere <u>except</u> on the putting green. This includes standing on the line or placing an object ahead of the player to assist in their alignment, but any object must be removed before the stroke is made. They can also stand behind the player and assist them in taking their alignment, but the caddie or partner <u>must</u> move away from the line of play <u>before</u> the player makes a stroke.

A caddie or partner is allowed to point out the line of play for a stroke on the putting green. This includes pointing at and touching the green with a hand, foot or anything they are holding, but must not improve the conditions affecting the stroke. They <u>are not allowed</u> to set objects down anywhere on or off the green to show the line of play. This is not allowed even if that object is removed before the stroke is made. The caddie or partner must move away from the line of play <u>before</u> the player takes their stance for the stroke on the putting green.

A player must not take a stance for the stroke anywhere on the course using any object (alignment rod or golf club) laid down on the ground to assist in lining up their feet or body.

If the player takes a stance in breach of this rule, they cannot avoid the penalty by backing away from the stance or removing the object.

Any breach of Rule 10 incurs a 2 stroke penalty.

#### General

#### Test your knowledge:

Peter tops his tee shot into heavy rough in front of the tee box. He decides it is unplayable and takes relief under Rule 19.2a and returns to the tee box. He asks if he is allowed to re-tee the ball.

What is the ruling?

- a) Drop it approximately where it was first teed up.
- b) Place it on a tee where it was first teed up.
- c) Tee it up anywhere within the teeing area.

## The Southwold Cleek

# Southwold Golf Club Junior Section prove Golf is a Young Persons' Game

The Junior Section at Southwold Golf Club is proving Golf is far from being an old man's game, with junior members of our club taking part and winning both Club and County Competitions.

The Gun Hill Cup was held on June 1st with 13 teams, consisting of two Juniors and two adults from Southwold Golf Club and local clubs in Norfolk and Suffolk. The competition, won this year by Rookery Park, was established in memory of popular former member Edward Cripps whose family are very supportive of the Club's development programme for junior golfers.

The Southwold Junior Open was held on 8th June in very wet conditions. But the juniors from a variety of local

clubs took it all in their stride and came in with good scores given the challenging conditions. **Harvey Fisher**, playing off a handicap of 13, won with 37 points.

Harvey has also been successful in winning the Thorpeness Junior Open by 3 shots with a gross of 80 nett 65 and the Norfolk Schools Champs at Eaton with a fantastic score of 82 less 17 handicap nett 63. **Joe Ford**, Southwold Junior Captain, also shot 85 nett 79 in this competition, and their combined scores were enough to send their school (Norwich School) through to the national finals at the English Schools Championships at Woodall Spa Golf Club in July.

Captain **Roger Sweet's** Charity this year is the Clare School in Norwich for children suffering from medical, sensory and learning difficulties. On 6<sup>th</sup> June 10 children, of whom 3 were in wheelchairs, visited the club where they took part in some fundamental golf games, using equipment lent by England

Golf. This proved a great experience for the children and it is planned to make it an annual event.

Much of the Club's success with the juniors is due to our new Professional Richard Smith, who joined us at the




